## A BILL

- To prohibit Federal funds from being used to implement, administer, enforce, or carry out programs with respect to digital health passes, and for other purposes.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
  - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
  - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Digital Health Pass
  - 5 Prevention Act" or "DHPPA".
  - 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
  - 7 The Congress finds the following:

1	(1) In the United States, States hold primary
2	public health powers.
3	(2) On April 2, 2021, Florida Governor Ron
4	DeSantis signed an executive order prohibiting the
5	use of COVID-19 digital health passes in the State
6	of Florida, citing privacy concerns and freedom as
7	the main reasons for the prohibition.
8	(3) On April 5, 2021, Texas Governor Greg Ab-
9	bott signed an executive order prohibiting the use of
10	COVID-19 digital health passes, declaring that
11	Texas agencies and political subdivisions, as well as
12	public and private organizations that receive public
13	funding from the State, cannot require people to
14	prove they have received a vaccination for the virus
15	that causes COVID-19.
16	(4) On April 7, 2021, Idaho Governor Brad
17	Little signed an executive order prohibiting any
18	State of Idaho governmental entity from requiring
19	an individual to provide a digital health pass, or
20	other proof of a vaccination for the virus that causes
21	COVID-19, before such individual may receive pub-
22	lic services or access to public facilities.
23	(5) On April 13, 2021, Montana Governor Greg
24	Gianforte issued an executive order prohibiting the
25	use of digital health passes.

1	(6) On April 19, 2021, Arizona Governor Doug
2	Ducey issued an executive order to prohibit all State
3	and local government entities from requiring individ-
4	uals to prove whether they have received a vaccina-
5	tion for the virus that causes COVID-19 prior to re-
6	ceiving services or entering into certain public areas.
7	(7) On April 25, 2021, Georgia Governor Brian
8	Kemp issued an executive order that prohibits the
9	State of Georgia from requiring COVID-19 digital
10	health passes.
11	(8) On May 11, 2021, South Carolina Governor
12	Henry McMaster issued a COVID-19 mandate that
13	prohibits the use of digital health passes across the
14	State of South Carolina and prevents schools and
15	public entities from implementing mask require-
16	ments.
17	(9) On May 24, 2021, Alabama Governor Kay
18	Ivey signed a bill that prevents State entities from
19	issuing digital health passes and prohibits businesses
20	from requiring a digital health pass in exchange for
21	services.
22	(10) The Tenth Amendment to the Constitution
23	requires that, "The powers not delegated to the
24	United States by the Constitution, nor prohibited by

1	it to the States, are reserved to the States respec-
2	tively, or to the people".
3	(11) The Federal Government may not bear the
4	responsibility of administrating mandatory programs
5	and subsequent devices as they relate to the health
6	of citizens.
7	(12) International Business Machines Corpora-
8	tion (IBM), a leading information technology com-
9	pany, is leading the development of digital health
10	passes, and has developed the "Excelsior Pass" as a
11	means for commercial enterprises to exclude individ-
12	uals who do not have such pass from attending pub-
13	licly accessible events.
14	(13) As of June 1, 2021, IBM has
15	over 350,000 employees, a market cap of \$129
16	billion, and does not require any amount of Federal
17	tax dollars from the fiscal year 2022 budget to
18	assist IBM with activities related to the
19	development of digital health passes.
20	SEC. 3. PROHIBITION ON FUNDING OF PROGRAMS WITH
21	RESPECT TO DIGITAL HEALTH PASSES.
22	(a) In General.—Notwithstanding any other provi-
23	sion of law, no Federal funds may be used to implement,
24	administer, enforce, or carry out programs with respect
25	to digital health passes.

- 1 (b) DIGITAL HEALTH PASS DEFINED.—The term
- 2 "digital health pass" means any standardized documenta-
- 3 tion for the purpose of certifying an individual's vaccina-
- 4 tion history to a third party, excluding any documentation
- 5 to the extent it is issued for the purpose of health care
- 6 records.
