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2021 ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION

1 **Relating to:** Wisconsin election reform and reclaiming the electoral ballots for
2 President and Vice President that were fraudulently certified.

3 Whereas, the Wisconsin Supreme Court stated in *Trump v. Biden*, 2020 WI 91,
4 “On March 25, 2020, the Dane and Milwaukee County Clerks issued guidance on
5 Facebook suggesting all voters could declare themselves indefinitely confined
6 because of the pandemic and the governor’s then-existing Safer-at-Home Order.
7 This court unanimously deemed that advice incorrect on March 31, 2020, and we
8 noted that the WEC guidance . . . provides the clarification on the purpose and proper
9 use of the indefinitely confined status that is required at this time,” which verifies
10 that the Elections Commission gave improper guidance in the 2020 election; and

11 Whereas, on December 7, 2020, Elections Commissioner Dean Knudson filed
12 a complaint against Meagan Wolfe under Wis. Stat. § 7.70 (5) for the rushed
13 ascertainment of certification of the 2020 election before time for filing an appeal of
14 the recount had passed, and revealed the planned haste to circumvent any further
15 discussion or objection; and

1 Whereas, the Assembly Committee on Campaigns and Elections has collected
2 nearly 3,000 documents and e-mails with connection to election manipulations by
3 the Center for Tech and Civic Life in five of Wisconsin's largest cities, and there are
4 five lawsuits in those cities against the Elections Commission; and

5 Whereas, data experts have studied the historical voter trends based on
6 population growth for both the entirety of the State of Wisconsin and its counties
7 individually, and those studies reveal the normal inverse relationship of data was not
8 present in the 2020 election results, which is a statistical impossibility; and

9 Whereas, the WisVote database reflects 7.1 million registered voters in a state
10 with a population of 5.8 million and a voting age population of 4.5 million, and the
11 WisVote database is riddled with incomplete and misrepresented data, including
12 thousands of voters with the same phone numbers, addresses, and faulty zip codes,
13 all of which reflects gross negligence in maintaining the database; and

14 Whereas, grassroots canvassing efforts reveal 200 addresses in 31 counties in
15 Wisconsin that have 200 to 400 registered voters at a single address, and a sampling
16 of 1,000 actual 2020 absentee ballot envelopes from Milwaukee County found 23
17 percent had questionable addresses; and

18 Whereas, the Elections Commission voted to do upgrades on Dominion voting
19 machines on June 2, 2021, and, following a press release on August 11, 2021, voicing
20 concerns about the deletion of log file data from those upgrades, the commission
21 voted to allow upgrades to new ES&S voting machines on September 9, 2021 with
22 no reassurances of protecting the data of the 2020 election on older machines, even
23 though it was revealed the upgrades do erase log file data kept on the machine hard
24 drives; and

1 Whereas, the audit report of the nonpartisan Legislative Audit Bureau
2 identified 44,272 voters who did not provide proper voter identification in the 2020
3 general election, revealed the mass increase of indefinitely confined voters from
4 4,505 in 2019 to 169,901 in 2020, and made 30 recommendations for the Elections
5 Commission to rectify their actions; and

6 Whereas, a total of 50 of the 69 county GOP parties released letters of support
7 or resolutions asking for further investigation into the elections process, showing
8 that over two-thirds of Wisconsin Republicans have no faith in the Elections
9 Commission; and

10 Whereas, commissioners and staff of the Elections Commission prevented the
11 deployment of special voting deputies to care facilities, as confirmed by the Racine
12 County Sheriff's Department, which found that on March 12, 2020, the Elections
13 Commission knowingly and willfully directed all 72 county clerks to violate Wis.
14 Stat. §§ 6.84 and 6.875 regarding absentee voting in certain residential care facilities
15 and retirement homes, and the commission's unlawful direction clearly broke Wis.
16 Stat. § 12.13 (2) (b) (7), which refers to intentionally violating election laws; and

17 Whereas, the U.S. Supreme Court has found that fraud vitiates and nullifies
18 any contract: *Boyce's Executors v. Grundy* (1830) 28 U.S. 210; "Fraud vitiates the
19 most solemn contracts, documents and even judgments." *United States v.*
20 *Throckmorton* (1878) 98 U.S. 61, 64; and

21 Whereas, the November 2020 Wisconsin general election, as regulated and
22 directed by the Elections Commission, was one of the most haphazard, controversial,
23 and poorly managed elections in state history, shaking citizens' confidence in fair
24 elections across Wisconsin, and with the culmination of these evidences, prove the

1 results of the commission's certification of the 2020 election are considered
2 fraudulent; now, therefore, be it

3 ***Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That*** the accumulated
4 evidence proves the actions taken by the Elections Commission to certify the 2020
5 presidential election shall be considered fraudulent under Wis. Stat. § 12.13 (2) (b)
6 (7); and, be it further

7 ***Resolved, That*** the Wisconsin Legislature, pursuant to its authority under
8 Article II, Section 1, Clause 2 and the Ninth and Tenth Amendments of the U.S.
9 Constitution, reclaims Wisconsin's 10 fraudulent electoral ballots cast for Joseph R.
10 Biden and Kamala Harris; and, be it further

11 ***Resolved, That*** the Wisconsin Legislature shall pass legislation with the
12 intention to clean up the WisVote database and create separate servers for active and
13 inactive voters; and, be it further

14 ***Resolved, That*** the Wisconsin Legislature supports a full forensic physical and
15 cyber audit of the 2020 general election, that this full forensic physical and cyber
16 audit should be conducted by an independent and nonpartisan auditing firm
17 approved by the Assembly Committee on Campaigns and Elections, and that this full
18 forensic physical and cyber audit must include the following components:

19 1. Total examination of voting system machines, including browsers,
20 tabulators, scanners, routers and firewalls, switches, network and out-of-band
21 management cards, internet or network connectivity, network and remote access,
22 remote access applications, software installed or removed on the system, flash
23 drives, thumb drives, event logs, scripts that have been run, the date on which data
24 were last modified and what data were modified, whether during or after the
25 election, systems and security updates, password policies, multifactor

1 authentication, databases, adjudication records, administrator accounts, and log-in
2 records.

3 2. Kinematic examination of all physical paper ballots, including whether
4 ballots meet industry maximum allowable compliance for out-of-calibration
5 measurements, ballot thickness to prevent bleed through, types of markers used,
6 printed ballots, quantity of ballots, ballot trail, voter roll in comparison to ballots,
7 mail-in ballot standards, and ballot watermarks and dot coding.

8 3. Physical canvas, including whether county clerks and election employees
9 and volunteers followed election rules and regulations mandated by their county.

10 4. Transparency; and, be it further

11 **Resolved, That** in order to ensure transparency, all such audits shall be
12 streamed live for public viewing and recorded via security video to be run 24 hours
13 a day, 7 days a week, until all such audits are complete; and, be it further

14 **Resolved, That** the Wisconsin Legislature shall pass legislation specifically
15 intended to secure the integrity of future elections in Wisconsin based on the findings
16 of the Legislative Audit Bureau investigation, the Assembly Committee on
17 Campaigns and Elections investigation, and the full forensic physical and cyber
18 audit; and, be it further

19 **Resolved, That** the secretary of state of the State of Wisconsin is hereby
20 directed to forward a proper authenticated copy of this resolution to the President
21 of the Senate of the United States.
